

1) Schedule:

- a) Will it be 5 full days of in-person learning? Yes
- b) Will drop off and pick up times remain the same? Yes, Dismissal will take longer because students will be dismissed from classrooms instead of grades being held together. We will have specific points of arrival/departure for egress into and out of the building.
- c) How will specials work? Some classes will move to related arts, and some related arts will come to the homeroom to minimize contact with multiple classes.
- d) Will the kids have recess? Yes Will they wear masks during recess? If they can remain 6' apart they do not have to wear masks. This will be monitored to see how students do. What will the protocols be? We will have to reduce the number of classes at recess at one time.

2) Academics:

- a) How will small groups be handled? Carefully, in the classroom. The use of the carpet might be used instead of pulling to the back table.
- b) How will teachers teach to different needs (i.e. academic differentiation)? They differentiate during Covid, the same as before Covid. Small group instruction is not the only use of differentiation.
- c) Will Encore and EE still get pulled out? At this time, we plan to do pull-out for EE and Encore by classes.

3) Florida Virtual:

- a) How will FVL work in the classroom? It is the curriculum for the year. Teachers have the academic freedom to enrich and remediate as they see fit. Will the children still be on computers during the day? No, "following FLVS" does not just mean being on the computer per se. How much of the day? We anticipate having very few computers in the classroom for the remainder of the 1<sup>st</sup> semester. Students who received MNPS computers will not be expected to bring computers back-and-forth. They will remain with students until they receive their 1-to-1 device from the district.
- b) If so, will they have their own computers? See (a)

4) What are the screening protocols for students? Families will be expected to check temperatures at home. At this time, schools will not be screening for temperatures per CDC guidelines for children.

5) What are the screening protocols for staff? Temperatures are checked and they must answer screening questions when signing in at the main office.

6) What are the sanitation procedures? The custodial staff will clean all classrooms and building nightly with a disinfectant. As part of their normal daily duties, high-use touch points are wiped down with disinfectant.

a) Will there be sanitation stations throughout the campus? Yes.

b) What about water fountains? At this time, we anticipate water fountains being turned off. We are waiting on guidance for bottle-filling stations.

c) How frequently will the classroom surfaces (plexiglass, light switches, door knobs, etc) be touched? Daily/nightly by custodial staff.

d) How will this impact the schedule? It could potentially delay some transitions between lunch and some specials.

7) Social distancing:

a) Will the children be 6 feet apart? When possible, but not at all times. If not, what is the plan? Students and staff will have to wear masks whenever in the building. 6' spacing is not possible in the classroom. In community areas such as hallways, we will expect 6' social distancing. Lots of handwashing.

b) Will there be plexiglass at desks or around the teacher? No. Teachers have received PPE and the option to use a face shield with their mask.

8) New cases:

a) What will happen if there is a case of coronavirus? The Health department will be notified. What will the shut down protocol be? The health department contact-tracers will determine who must be quarantined. The specific classroom will be moved for one day for nighttime, heavier sanitization by the custodial company.

b) Will the children stay in pods to allow for contact tracing? Children are assigned to classrooms, not pods. We will minimize mixing with students from other classes as much as possible in order to minimize contact-tracing exposure. PLT, unless a student has a pull-out session, will be in the classroom.

c) If a child has to quarantine and his/her class does not (for suspected contact outside of school) how will s/he keep up with the work? They will have access to the FLVS curriculum. At this time, we do not anticipate transferring them to a virtual teacher while quarantining, but that might be an option.

9) What will be done to filter the air? The district changes air filters quarterly.

10) Other:

a) What will happen during lunch? The lunchroom will be used at 50% capacity. Children will be assigned specific seats to enable contact tracing if needed. Otherwise, they will eat in the

classroom. We anticipate rotating classes through the cafeteria. Meaning, a class might eat in the cafeteria 2-3 times per week, and other days they will eat in the classroom. Box lunches will be served by the cafeteria.

b) Will the hallways be one way or how will children move throughout the school? One way where feasible. Students will be expected to socially-distance 6' when walking in the hallway. If a hallway is two-way we will coordinate traffic 1 class at a time. As always, classes will be expected to "stay to the right" of the hallway.

11) What will the outside guest policy be? Guests will not be allowed in the building. In the case of a required meeting, adults will have to follow Covid-19 screening protocols in place for staff.
